Inspiration for your future career...

Lord Darzi's review of the NHS calls for a left shift in both resources *and autonomy* to primary care. He recognises that some of today's most complex care - like managing multimorbidity - happens in general practice. Our complex problem-solving (knowledge work) skills apply to our clinical patient-facing work, but can also have applications beyond this. Wisdom course

To support your patient-facing work, modules 1-3 explore how you can develop your knowledge work skills and manage complex patient presentations (for example, people presenting with multimorbidity, problematic polypharmacy and persistent physical symptoms). Module 4 of the Wisdom course is focused on how WiseGPs can develop their future careers. Our everyday work seeing patients is already complex, busy and challenging, so some may feel they don't want to take on other roles, but if you were interested in developing a portfolio career, this free course could give you some direction.
